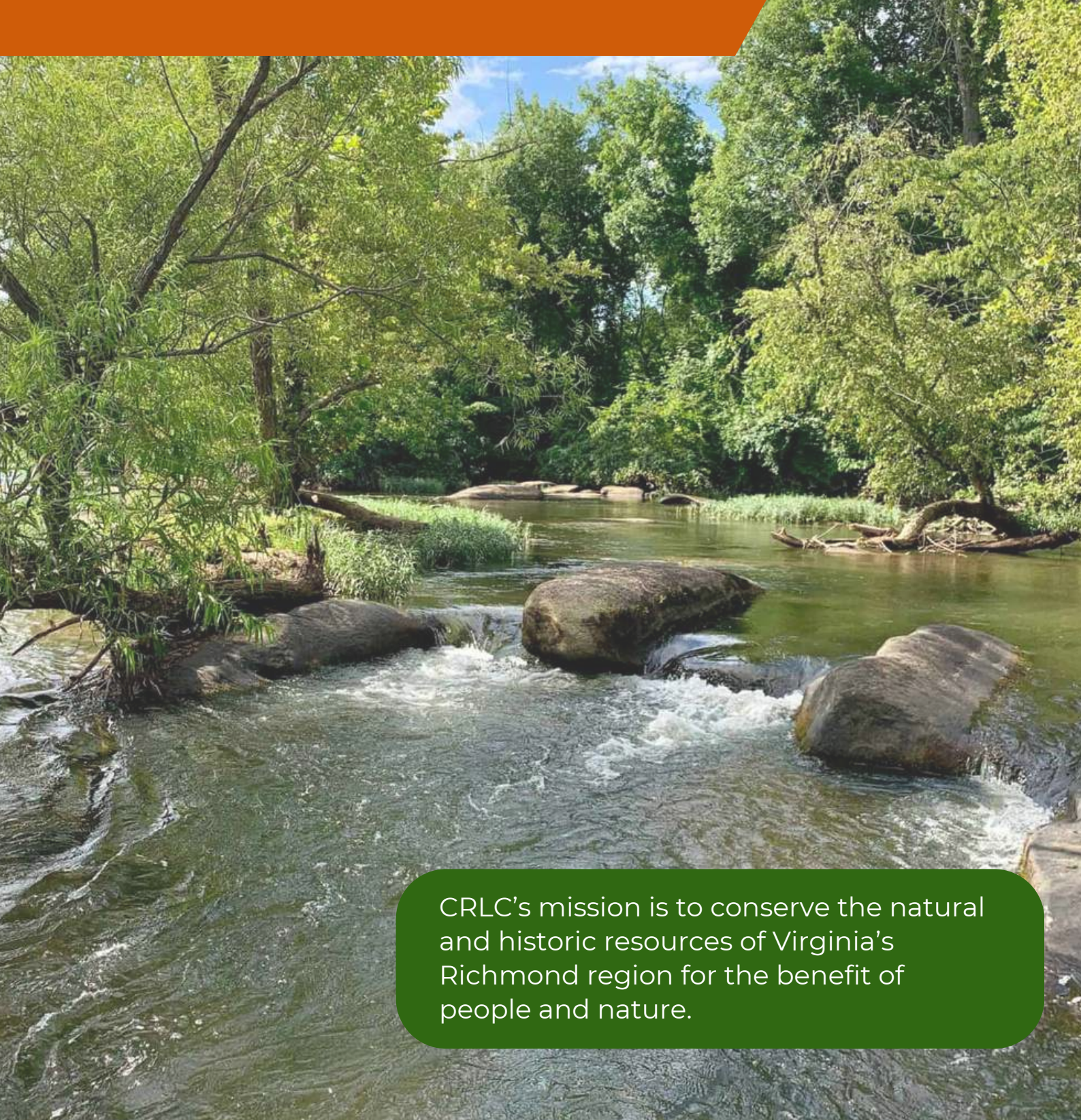


Corporate Partnership Opportunities

What We Do

It is our belief that the natural and historic resources of the Richmond region are vitally important to preserve. Our work spans the protection of rivers and streams, the preservation of battlefields, the expansion of and equitable access to public greenspace, the restoration of endangered habitats, the security of our farmland, and so much more. CRLC's work in conservation easements, land acquisitions, and community engagement and education helps protect these resources for your benefit and that of future generations.

Impact

Where else can you make a difference that will still be here over 100 years from now? CRLC's conserved lands are legally protected in perpetuity with regular monitoring, maintenance, and stewardship.



Growth

Since 2005, CRLC has been the only local land trust serving exclusively the greater Richmond region. We have conserved more than 15,000 acres with one-third of these successes occurring in the past 5 years.



Leverage

For every \$100 you give, CRLC has been able to raise an additional \$10,000. That's a 100x return on your investment!

CRLC is nationally accredited by the Land Trust Alliance for our sound finances, ethical conduct, responsible governance, and lasting stewardship. CRLC has received four Governors' Environmental Excellence Awards for our conservation in the Richmond region.

Exclusively Local Land Conservation

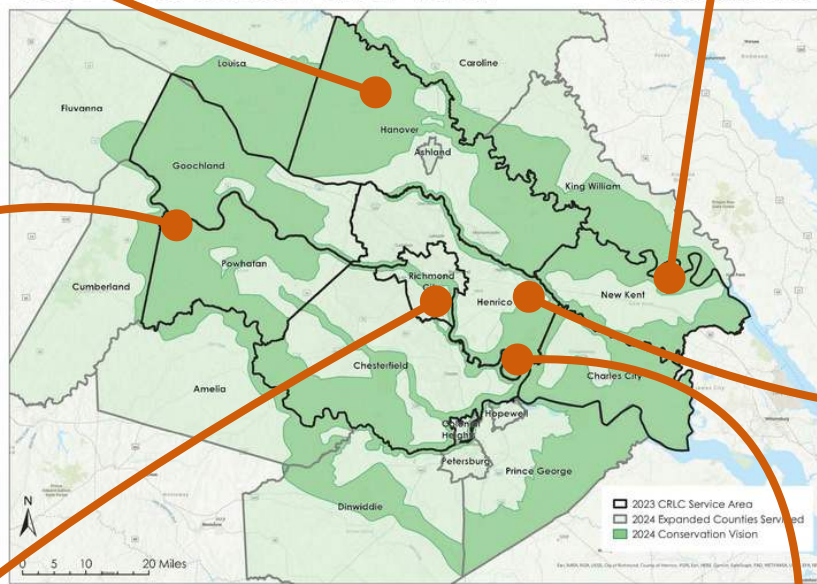
CRLC protects over 800 acres in New Kent County between two historic properties known respectively as Rockahock and Eltham Farm.

CRLC's new strategic plan expands its service area and establishes an ambitious Conservation Vision. This vision seeks to increase the permanently protected land in the Richmond region from 6% to 10% by 2030, representing approximately 65,000 new acres.



CRLC co-holds the conservation easement on the James River Park System, and facilitated its expansion of nearly 30 acres, most notably Mayo's Island, Dock Street Park, Rogers Woods, and the Brander Street segment of the Richmond Slave Trail.



CRLC owns and maintains the Varina LandLab, a 353-acre publicly accessible nature area with trails, habitat restoration projects, and outdoor education opportunities along the James River.
